3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution

DK ALBORG01: only upon request from the student in question and **E MADRID05:** no later than four weeks

after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]

4. Termination of the agreement

DK ALBORG01: [In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.]
