- A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than four weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. I Roma 16: no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- Termination of the agreement In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

I ROMA16:

The credits mentioned in Roma Tre transcripts are equal to ECTS. One credit represents 25 hours of study, with one full time academic year consisting of 60 ECTS credits. The grading system used at the University Roma Tre is the national grading system:

Passing grades for each exam or learning activity can range from 18 to 30. The highest possible grade is 30 e lode (30L). For some exams and activities there is no grade, but only "pass" (IDONEO).

Graduation grades can range from 66 to 110. The highest possible grade is 110/110 with honours. The final graduation mark depends on the average of exams grades and the academic value of the thesis and of its defense; the latter is evaluated by a commission of members of the Faculty.
