I SASSARI01:

-The receiving institution will send its decision within 2/3 weeks.

-A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 4 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines].

-Termination of the agreement: The present Bilateral Agreement will be valid for the academic years mentioned above unless either side terminates the present Agreement in writing by June 1st of the year prior to the academic year concerned. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

E MADRID05:

- The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks from the application deadline.

- A Transcript of Records with attendance dates will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. If the transcript is issued directly to the student, a scanned copy of the transcript of records will be sent to the international office of the sending institution.

- Termination of the agreement: In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

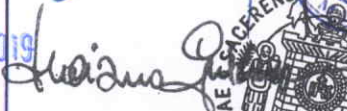
