PL CZESTOC01:

The Learning Agreement should be negotiated and agreed on by three sides – sending institution, receiving institution and the student – before student's arrival.

At the CUT the faculty's dean/vice-dean + both coordinators (faculty and institutional) will sign it to be valid.

Letter of Acceptance will be given by CUT not earlier than the Learning Agreement (students) or Mobility Agreement (staff) established.

2. After having received the nomination letter/email, application form with all enclosures and Learning Agreement by an e-mail at least, the letter of admission will be sent by PL CZESTOC01 within a max. of five weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving Institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
4. Termination of the agreement

This agreement shall remain in force until the end of the Programme (2020/21). In case of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 2014 will only take effect as of 1 September 2014+1. "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

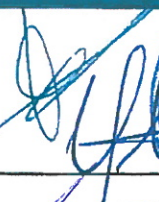

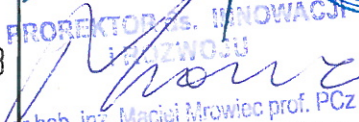
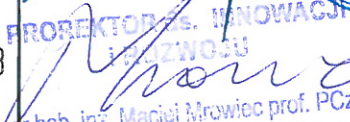
