Instituto Politécnico de Setúbal: Grades will be assigned according to the <u>European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)</u> and the ECTS grading scale:

ECTS Grade	% of successful students normally achieving the grade	Definition
А	10	Excellent: outstanding performance with only minor errors.
В	25	Very Good: above average standard but with some errors.
С	30	Good: generally sound work with a number of notable errors.
D	25	Satisfactory: fair but with significant shortcomings.
E	10	Sufficient: performance meets the minimum criteria.
F	-	Fail: some more work required before credit can be awarded.

The Portuguese grading system is ranked on a scale of 0 to 20. The minimum mark required for approval is 10. The qualitative scale is: 0 - 9 insufficient; 10 - 13 sufficient; 14 - 15 good; 16 - 17 very good; 18 - 20 excellent.
