- 2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks from the application deadline.
- 3. A Transcript of Records with attendance dates will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. If the transcript is issued directly to the student, a scanned copy of the transcript of records will be sent to the international office of the sending institution.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
